# Celebrating New Beginnings for Our Clients and Our Organization

## A LETTER FROM OUR BOARD CHAIR

Each year at Her Justice, we witness the power of new beginnings—and this year was marked by exciting client victories, impactful policy projects, and a leadership transition concluding a powerful decade of growth and advocacy and beginning the next chapter in our organization's history, as we bid farewell to former Executive Director Amy Barasch and welcomed Alexia Korberg at our helm.



We move into this chapter from a position of strength, with a deep understanding of the impact Her Justice has on our city. Our legal services work and our corresponding policy work offer economic justice, gender justice, and racial justice for the women we serve and, more broadly, other New Yorkers engaging with the civil justice system.

This year, we're particularly proud to have released our second original policy report, *Stories from Immigrant Survivors of Gender-Based Violence: The Impact of Work Authorization*. Built on in-depth interviews with Her Justice clients, the report found that receiving work authorization has a profound impact for women in areas outside the scope of employment itself. That ripple effect extends to safety from abuse from partners, employers, and landlords; increased likelihood of engaging with law enforcement, healthcare, legal, and education systems; and more. These outcomes are transformative for our clients. And, what's more, their implications reach beyond individual women. Ultimately, they create a safer, healthier New York City that benefits all of us as neighbors and community members. Findings and associated policy recommendations were presented to federal, state, and city officials and the report was cited in a class action lawsuit against the Department of Homeland Security. We're excited to share more about that in this report.

In FY 2024 Her Justice served nearly 4,000 women and children across all five boroughs. Three-fourths of our clients were born outside the U.S., coming from 103 countries across the world. 92% of our clients were women of color, 85% were survivors of intimate partner violence, and 70% were mothers. **We recruited and mentored approximately 1,500 volunteer attorneys, unlocking an historic \$45 million of free legal services** from the private sector and investing it into the civil justice system.

We're proud of, and so grateful for, our coalition of law firms, pro bono attorneys, donors, community partners, policymakers, staff, and clients that made this possible. As we look to a new day ahead, we're inspired by our community's commitment to both individual lives and the broader pursuit of justice—ensuring that women in New York City have the resources they need to see fair outcomes from the civil justice system and that their experiences reshape it, for all of us, for the better.

# What We Do

Having a civil justice system we can count on is essential for all of us—and especially for our clients. That's because wins inside the courtroom shift power into the hands of women we serve.

**Her Justice clients often have complicated, interconnected legal needs**, and it's common for a single Her Justice client to experience multiple victories along the way. She might be freed from coerced debt as part of a divorce proceeding, be granted an order of protection while working on a custody decision, or receive a work permit while waiting for a final decision on her legal status in the US.

All of these wins help our clients create new beginnings for themselves and their families because **they pave the way for change beyond the courtroom**—like building financial independence through steady employment, securing safe housing for children, or pursuing an education that was once out of reach. These outcomes make it possible for our clients to start fresh.

## How We Do It

Her Justice creates a more fair and functional civil justice system in two ways:

- 1 Providing free civil legal services** in family, matrimonial, and immigration cases so women have the power of an excellent attorney at their side.
- 2 Advocating for policies** that improve the system for women like our clients and all New Yorkers.

**We work with clients to address their high-stakes legal needs—and pursue strategic policy reform—in areas such as:**

- Legal status, work authorization, and other protections for undocumented New Yorkers
- Divorce
- Child support and spousal support
- Orders of protection
- Coerced debt and credit repair
- Labor and sex trafficking

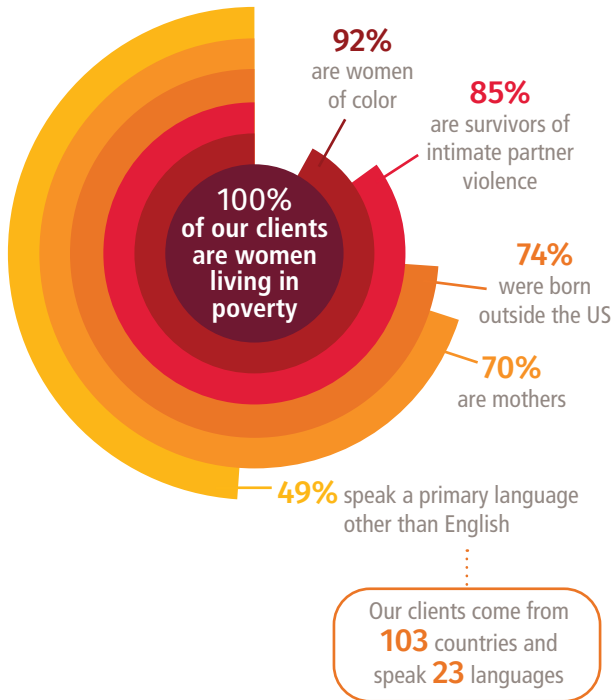

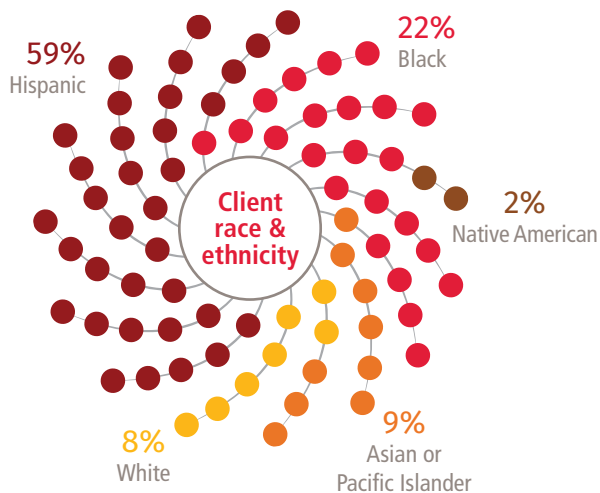
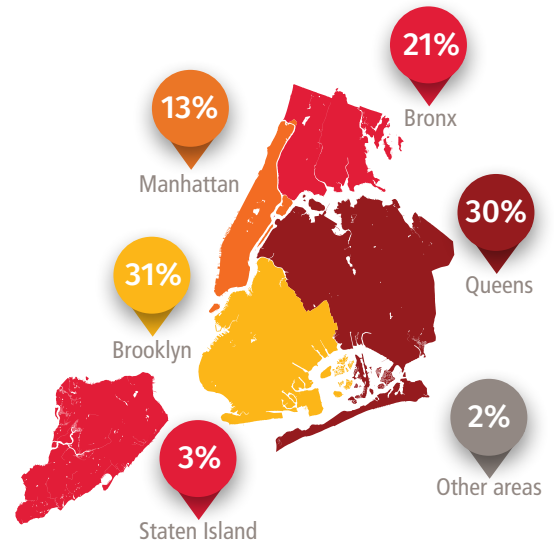

A snapshot of FY 2024 Her Justice clients



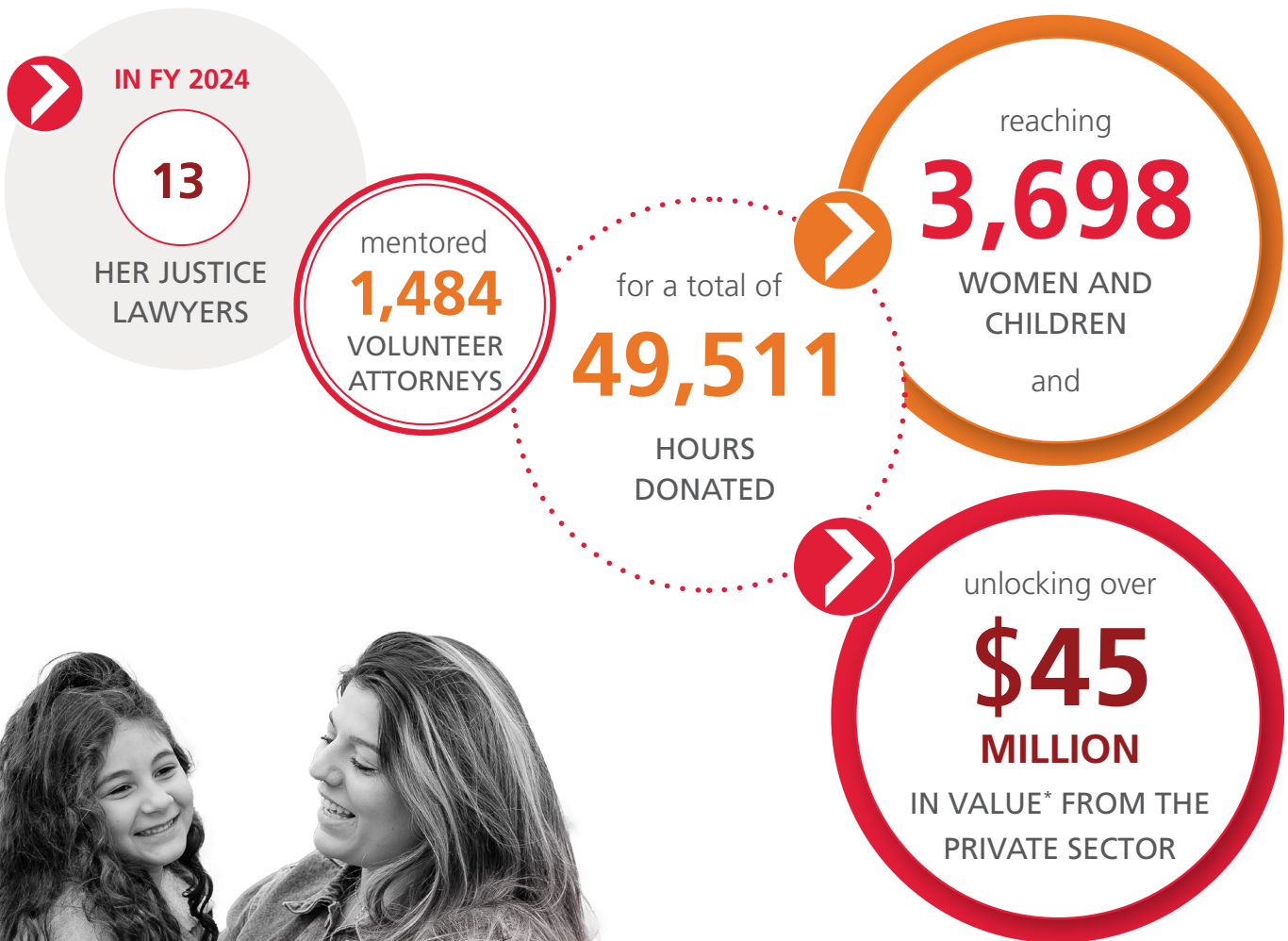

# Our Pro Bono Model at Work

The promise of pro bono is that by matching the private sector's exceptional skills and resources with Her Justice's expertise in the civil justice system, we can tilt the system's power back towards those who need its solutions most. Every year we train and mentor thousands of volunteer attorneys to do just that. In FY 2024, we reached 3,698 women and children and invested over \$45 million from the private sector into our communities and the civil justice system.

# The Her Justice Ripple Effect

The impact of Her Justice's work reverberates through our New York community.

**Clients** break familial cycles of abuse and poverty through individual civil justice wins that change not just their life trajectories, but their children's and grandchildren's, as well. **Systems** are improved for millions of New Yorkers because of our policy work.\* **Pro bono attorneys** gain a deep sense of purpose and professional growth, often emerging with a greater sense of responsibility for their communities and empathy for experiences different from their own. And our **broader professional community** feels the benefits, too, as Her Justice puts our three decades of expertise to work building stronger, more informed legal, judicial, and nonprofit communities.

We equip professionals across sectors to better serve New Yorkers seeking justice through our systems. Beyond Her Justice's own pro bono attorneys working with our clients, **in FY 2024 we trained an additional 1,653 attorneys and 626 other professionals** on topics such as trauma-informed lawyering, coercive control within intimate partner violence and how that shows up in courtrooms, and in ethics and professional responsibility for new attorneys—building capacity at local and national levels to ensure our systems run more smoothly and better serve us all.

# A New Chapter: Her Justice Welcomes Our Next Executive Director



Her Justice partnered with premier social impact search firm Koya Partners | Diversified Search Group in 2024 to conduct our search for the right person to take our organization into the next phase of our history. We set out to identify a leader with clear strategic vision, a sophisticated understanding of partnering across communities, and a deep commitment to gender, racial, and economic justice—and we were thrilled to find that in Alexia Korberg.

Alexia Korberg (they/them) joined Her Justice on September 9, 2024 (FY 2025) from the preeminent law firm Paul, Weiss, Rifkind, Wharton & Garrison, where they served as a partner in the Litigation Department and as Deputy Chair of the M&A Litigation Practice Group. In addition to their robust commercial disputes and trial practice, Alexia has developed a nationally-recognized constitutional impact litigation practice and has litigated well over a dozen important civil and human rights cases in courts across the country, including three cases at the Supreme Court. They represented

LGBTQ+ rights pioneer Edie Windsor in the first Supreme Court case establishing a constitutional right to same-sex marriage; their longtime client, Mississippi's last abortion provider, in *Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization*; and most recently trans youth challenging Idaho's criminal ban on gender affirming care. Alexia has received numerous awards and recognitions as a tireless defender of women's rights, LGBTQ+ people, immigrants, and the rule of law; for their high-profile litigation achievements; and for their commitment to improving the legal profession. Alexia's work has been

featured in *The New York Times*, *The Washington Post*, *the National Law Journal*, *The American Lawyer*, *Slate*, and elsewhere, and they are regularly invited to speak throughout the nation about their practice.

# Advancing Our Policy Agenda

Our policy agenda is shaped by the lived experience of our clients. In FY 2024, Her Justice pursued more than 40 policy initiatives to put power in the hands of women like our clients and create a civil justice system that works better for all of us.

- **Testifying and submitting written testimony** for state and city hearings relating to gender equity, intimate partner violence, the need for robust legal services for low-income New Yorkers, and the modernization of New York courts in order to provide full access to justice.
- **Meeting with policymakers** to share the findings and recommendations for reform from our immigration policy research report *Stories from Immigrant Survivors of Gender-Based Violence: The Impact of Work Authorization* and to elevate issues around Family Court reform, child support, and consumer protection for survivors of intimate partner violence.
- **Joining City Council's New Arrivals Strategy Team** to put our expertise to work by strengthening how our city integrates newcomers and provides supportive services for all New Yorkers.
- **Successfully advocating for a national regulatory change** to waive fees for virtually all immigration applications to United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) based on gender-based violence claims.
- **Submitting amicus briefs** in support of legal cases concerning the rights of immigrants and survivors of intimate partner violence.
- **Advocating for federal, state, and city legislation** around gender equity, the rights of survivors of gender-based violence, the rights of immigrants to a fair legal process and public benefits, funding for civil legal services, and more.
- **Presenting at conferences and public events** around Family Court reform and the needs of immigrant New Yorkers with other advocates and policymakers.
- **Supporting coalition advocacy** to federal and state policymakers regarding changes in policy to benefit immigrants, survivors of gender-based violence, and women living in poverty.

# Stories from Immigrant Survivors of Gender-Based Violence: The Impact of Work Authorization

Her Justice's latest report offers our clients' perspectives on the profound effects work permits have for immigrant survivors and drives advocacy to improve the U.S. immigration system.

## ABOUT THE REPORT

Released in November 2023, our newest original research report brings forward the experiences of immigrant survivors seeking legal permission to work in the United States and explores the impact of obtaining work authorization on their lives—as women, mothers, and workers.

Since Her Justice's founding, over half of our clients have been undocumented. Today, more than one third of our clients partner with us to file for legal status. In their own words, by the time they find us, they've often been struggling to stay afloat in the U.S. for years. And from there, **even with a lawyer at their side, it takes more than five years to receive the legal right to work.** In that time, they're vulnerable to exploitation—from employers, landlords, and abusive intimate partners—and charting a path forward towards the life they envision is difficult.

At Her Justice, we know things can be different. Once clients receive their work permit, **"it's like the world opens"** (Fabiola, Her Justice client, received work authorization in 2018) and they can begin building safer, stronger futures for themselves, their families, and their communities.

That's where this report comes in. Building from in-depth interviews with Her Justice clients, it captures **stories and data** critical to understanding how the U.S.'s immigration and civil justice systems function today. It provides timely **context and nuance** relevant to our national discussions about immigration policy brought about by today's influx of migrants to our borders. And it builds on our clients' experiences to make **recommendations to federal, state, and local policymakers** about how to reform the system so that the greatest number of immigrant women can obtain and preserve the best possible immigration status through a process that prioritizes their safety and dignity.

# ABOUT OUR ADVOCACY

### Federal Advocacy

The report has reached the offices of 14 U.S. Senate and House representatives. In addition, Her Justice presented a Congressional briefing on the report in April 2024 and held follow-up meetings with the offices of U.S. Rep. Nanette Barragán (D-CA), Rep. Adriano Espaillat (D-NY), Rep. Daran Soto (D-FL), Rep. Sylvia Rodriguez Garcia (D-TX), and Rob Menendez Jr. (D-NJ).

→ *A month after its release, our report was cited in a class action lawsuit against the Department of Homeland Security. The lawsuit was filed on behalf of eight plaintiffs who are survivors of crime who assisted law enforcement, filed U visa applications more than two years ago, and are still awaiting initial bona fide determinations which would provide them access to work permits and protection from deportation while they wait in years-long backlogs for their cases to be fully considered.*

### New York State and New York City Advocacy

The report has reached Governor Hochul's office, key State and City government agencies, and more than 65 peer organizations.

→ *In September 2024, Her Justice opened the New York State Bar Association's Partnership Conference with an impactful plenary session "Amplifying Legal Services Client Stories to Support Policy Reform and Advocacy," presenting our report to an audience of approximately 500 practitioners from around the state.*

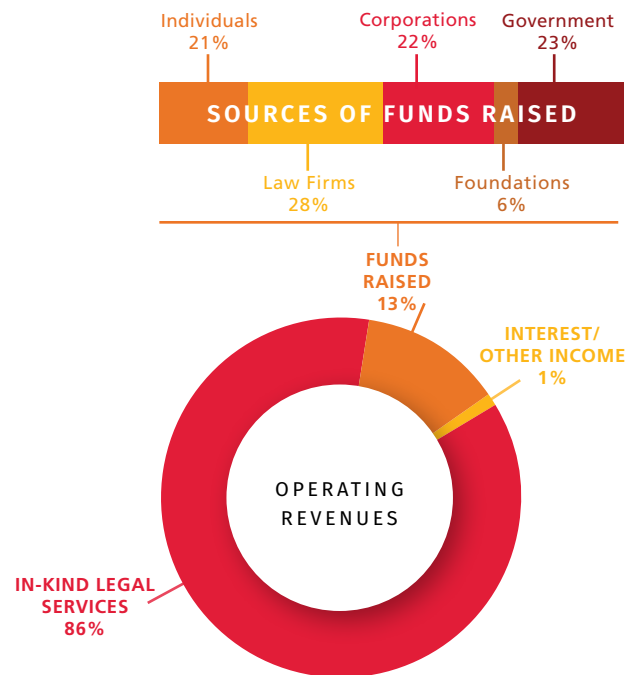

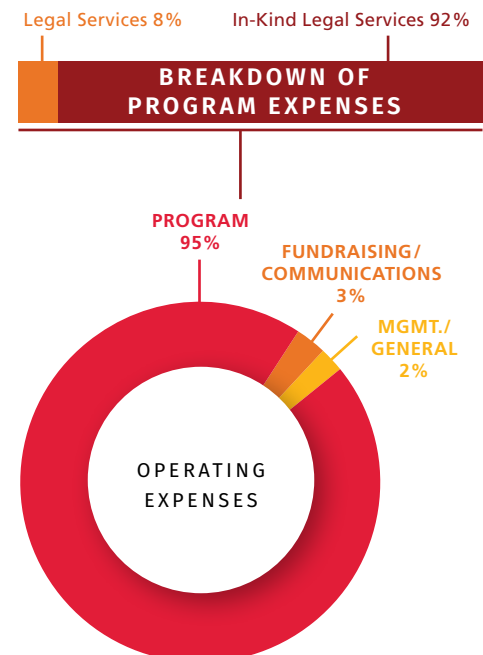
